

- **AS9000 and AS9100:** These documents, published by the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE International), standardize QMS requirements for the aerospace industry. ISO 9001: 1994 is the base framework for both.
- **CMDCAS (Canadian Medical Devices Conformity Assessment System):** Recent Health Canada regulations mean certain medical devices need to be manufactured under a registered QMS conforming to ISO 13485 or 13488—standards providing specific ISO 9000 requirements for the medical devices field. Health Canada has selected SCC to qualify accredited ISO 9000 registration bodies to register these QMS systems under the CMDCAS program. The Medical Devices Regulations will come into force Jan. 1, 2003. - **CAN/CSA-Z809:** ISO 14000 EMS registration bodies can be accredited to register forest companies to this CSA International standard. CAN/CSA-Z809, *A Sustainable Forest Management System: Specifications Document*, developed by a consensus of stakeholders, contains requirements for an ISO 14000-style sustainable forest management (SFM) system.
